#### Section 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

<b>Workplace Facilities Required:</b>	Eye wash and safety shower facilities are required in workplaces.
<b>If Inhaled:</b>	Remove to fresh air. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Monitor symptoms. Seek medical attention if symptoms persist.
<b>In Contact with Eye:</b>	Hold eyes open, flush continuously with water for at least 20 minutes. Seek immediate medical attention.
<b>In Contact with Skin:</b>	Wash skin with plenty of water, while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash contaminated clothing before re-use. Seek medical attention if skin irritation develops and persists.
<b>If Swallowed:</b>	DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Rinse mouth. Give small quantities of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Seek immediate medical attention. If vomiting occurs, keep head below hips to prevent aspiration to lungs.

#### Section 5: FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

<b>Fire/Explosion Hazard:</b>	Product is not flammable or combustible.
<b>Suitable Extinguishing Media:</b>	Use an extinguishing agent suitable for surrounding fire. Do not use water jet as this may spread the fire.
<b>Precautions in Connection with Fire:</b>	May give off noxious fumes in a fire containing oxides of zinc, copper, magnesium, and sulphur.
<b>Advice for firefighters:</b>	Wear full firefighting gear and self-contained breathing apparatus. Ensure fire water is contained on site. Block off all drains.

#### Section 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**An emergency response plan meeting the requirements of Part 5 of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017 is required when held in quantities greater than 100kg.**

<b>Precautions:</b>	Clear area of all unprotected personnel. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering area. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Avoid generating dust. Avoid release to drains, waterways. If product does enter drains/waterways
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advise the local pollution hotline.

**Suitable Protective Equipment:** Emergency responders must use personal protective equipment, including gloves, protective overalls and footwear, safety goggles, and respiratory protection.

**Spill or Leak Procedures.** Contain the spill. Sweep up spills with dust binding material and place in a suitable, closable chemical waste container. Alternatively, an industrial vacuum cleaner may be used to collect spilled material. Ensure waste container is properly labelled.

**Waste Disposal Methods:** Dispose of as per Section 13.

**Emergency preparation:** Ensure there is appropriate and adequate personal protective equipment, trained personnel and clean up materials for management of accidental release.

## Section 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

**Precautions for Safe Handling:** Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Do not breathe dust. Do not release to drains/waterways. Do not eat, drink, or smoke when using this product. Remove contaminated clothing and wash hands and face before entering eating areas.

**Storage:** Keep out of reach of children. Keep in original container or a suitable alternative made of compatible material. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area away from direct sunlight.

**Site Storage Requirements:** Site Signage will be required when quantities exceed 100kg. For incompatibilities refer to Section 10.

## Section 8: EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

**Workplace Exposure Standards NZ:** Particulates, not otherwise specified, TWA 10 mg/m<sup>3</sup> (inspirable dust), 3 mg/m<sup>3</sup> (respirable dust).

**Engineering Controls:** Eyewash facilities and safety showers should be provided in the work area where there is a risk of exposure to eyes and skin. If use generates dust, use engineering controls such as local exhaust ventilation to ensure workers are not exposed to levels exceeding the exposure standards.

**Personal Protective Equipment:** Avoid contact with the skin and eyes. Avoid inhaling dust.

**Hand protection:** Wear protective gloves. Refer to Australian and New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 2161 for protective gloves.

**Skin and body protection:** Use protective clothing. Remove any contaminated clothing to avoid prolonged contact with the skin. Wash work clothes regularly. Refer to Australian and New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 4501 for occupational protective clothing.

**Eye protection:** Use safety goggles to protect eyes. Refer to AS/NZS 1336 for suitable eye and

face protection.

**Respiratory protection:** Where there is inadequate ventilation, and use results in the formation of dust, use a respirator. Refer to AS/NZS 1715 and AS/NZS 1716 for suitable respiratory protection. Respirator selection must be based on known or anticipated exposure levels, the hazards of the product and the safe working limits of the selected respirator. A full-face respirator may be desirable to give respiratory and eye protection.

**Other information:** PPE selected must be impervious to the substance. Do not eat, smoke, or drink where material is handled, processed, or stored. Wash hands carefully before eating, drinking, or smoking. Handle in accordance with safe industrial hygiene practices.

## Section 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

### Acute Exposure

<b>Acute Toxicity:</b>	Not classified as acutely toxic. LD <sub>50</sub> oral > 2000 mg/kg. LD <sub>50</sub> dermal > 2000 mg/kg LC <sub>50</sub> inhalation > 5 mg/L
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**Inhalation:** Inhaling dust may cause irritation to mucous membranes resulting in coughing, sneezing, shortness of breath.

**Ingestion:** Ingestion of large quantities may cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, and diarrhoea.

**Skin Corrosion/Irritation:** Not expected to be a skin irritant.

**Serious Eye Damage/Eye Irritation:** Product is corrosive to the eyes and may cause redness, pain, weeping, blurred vision, corneal burns, and blindness.

**Respiratory or Skin Sensitisation:** Product is a skin sensitiser and may cause an allergic skin reaction. Not expected to be a respiratory sensitiser.

### **Chronic Exposure:**

**Mutagen/Carcinogen/Reproductive Toxicant** No information available. Product is not expected to be mutagenic, carcinogenic or a reproductive toxicant.

## **Section 12: ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION**

**Ecotoxicity:** LC<sub>50</sub> < 1 mg/L for fish, crustaceans, and algae.

Product is very toxic to aquatic life with both short and long-term effects. Avoid losses of undiluted product to the environment wherever possible.

**Persistence/degradability:** Not expected to be rapidly biodegradable.

**Bioaccumulation:** No information available.

**Mobility in soil:** No information available.

**Other adverse effects:** None identified.

**Ingredients with Ecotoxic classifications:** Copper Sulphate has been classified as very toxic to the aquatic environment with both short term and long-term effects. The M factor for Copper Sulphate is 100, therefore the product is classified as very toxic to the aquatic environment due to the concentration of copper sulphate in the product.

Zinc Sulphate and Alpha Pinene have also been classified as very toxic to the aquatic environment with both short term and long-term effects.

Additionally, Manganese Sulphate has been classified as toxic to the aquatic environment with long term effects.

Iron Sulphate is rapidly converted to insoluble iron oxides which binds tightly to soil.

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There are no other ingredients present in the formulation with ecotoxic classifications.

Toxicity data is based on hazardous ingredient information and concentrations and information for those ingredients in the EPA Chemical Classification and Identification Database and the European Chemical Agencies Database.

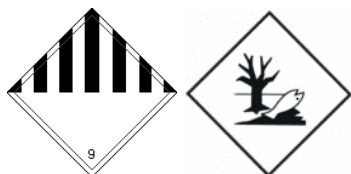
